Session 2: Navigating the politics of water security in times of uncertainty



Prof. Lyu Xing

Professor, School of International Studies of Yunnan University, P.R. China.

Xing Lyu, a professor at the School of International Studies of Yunnan University. Prof. Lyu has been engaged in Langcang-Mekong water issues through research, dialogue and training since 2006.

He has undertaken several research projects, written academic papers, blogs and essays and actively engaged in discussions on issues related to Langcang-Mekong Water from nature, social and political perspectives. He observes that 1) many water issues in Mekong are primarily resulted from climate changes normally or un-normally, 2) geo-political competition may not necessarily lead to political tension but cooperation, and 3) there are other security issues more important than water.



Dr. Bach Tan Sinh

SUMERNET Steering Committee Co-Chair; Associate Partner, Viet Insight, Vietnam. Dr. Bach Tan Sinh is currently Associate Partner of Viet Insight.
