



Lancang-Mekong Research and Policy Forum

Strengthening research-policy cooperation and partnerships to address water security in times of uncertainty in the Lancang-Mekong Region 27-28 October, 1:00 pm to 4:30 pm (Bangkok time, ICT) (Version: October 25, 2021)

Rationale:

Water politics and the tensions around water resource use and allocation between parties is a major issue in water insecurity within the Lancang-Mekong Region. This combined with contemporary socio-economic and political dynamics and climate change impacts bring additional burdens to the lives of the water insecure, particularly disrupting the lives of poor and other marginalized groups in the region.

There have been significant efforts from different stakeholders to use water diplomacy to address political factors around water insecurity. Regional platforms for water cooperation like the Mekong River Commission (MRC) and Lancang-Mekong Cooperation (LMC) cooperate beyond national borders to use dialogue, data sharing and joint projects to resolve these issues.

Additionally, to improve water diplomacy, researchers from different countries within the region have contributed to research on water insecurity to enhance decision making. However, there is often a disconnect between science and policy implementation: findings and recommendations of researchers are not always effectively disseminated to the wider public or meet the needs of the decision-makers for policy and practice.

Considering the COVID-19 pandemic and other challenges, it is now more necessary than ever to engage in multistakeholder dialogue to bridge science and policy to address water insecurity.

Sustainable Mekong Research Network (SUMERNET) is organizing this <u>two-day event</u> "Lancang-Mekong Research and Policy Forum on "Strengthening research-policy cooperation and partnerships to address water security in times of uncertainty in the Lancang-Mekong Region" as part of SUMERNET Annual Meeting in 2021.

SUMERNET comprises the network members (SNMs) from the six Lancang-Mekong countries and the Steering Committee (SSC) representing network members with the technical support of the SUMERNET Secretariat hosted at Stockholm Environment Institute (SEI) Asia Centre, Bangkok.

Objectives of the Lancang-Mekong Research and Policy Forum are:

- 1. To exchange knowledge and experiences among researchers, practitioners, and policymakers in the Lancang-Mekong Region on how they address water insecurity in times of political, social and economic uncertainty.
- 2. To enhance understanding of opportunities to engage with ongoing regional water cooperation mechanisms in the Lancang-Mekong Region.
- **3.** To strengthen networks and partnerships amongst researchers, policymakers and practitioners from all six countries in the Lancang-Mekong Region.
- **4.** To cooperate on joint research, actions or other practical activities to support decision making processes in the Lancang-Mekong Region.

The Research Forum on the first day will be an open space for senior and young researchers and practitioners from the upper and lower countries of the Lancang-Mekong Region to exchange knowledge





and experiences on various issues related to water insecurity. The aim is to strengthen networks and partnerships in the region.

The Policy Forum on the second day will be an opportunity for policy dialogue among researchers, practitioners and policymakers associated with SUMERNET and friends of SUMERNET from the Embassy of Sweden, Thailand's Office of the National Water Resources (ONWR), the MRC Secretariat, LMC Water Centre, governmental agencies, universities and other stakeholders to understand their current efforts and policy needs for reducing water insecurity in times of uncertainty, especially with COVID-19 pandemic. The forum also seeks to identify common interests for further cooperation on joint research, actions or other activities that concerned parties consider as feasible.

About SUMERNET:

Since its founding in 2005, Sustainable Mekong Research Network (SUMERNET), a regional research network, has been supporting policy-relevant research and outreach activities to inform and engage decision-makers, planners and stakeholders, bringing together research partners engaged in sustainable development in the six countries of the Mekong Region: Cambodia, China (specifically Yunnan Province and Guangxi Zhuang Autonomous Region), Lao PDR, Myanmar, Thailand, and Vietnam. Within this context, it pursues an evolving agenda in response to questions and policy issues that arise in the region. With continued funding support of the Embassy of Sweden through the Swedish International Development Cooperation Agency (Sida), SUMERNET 4 All (2018-2023), current phase of SUMERNET has the focus on reducing water insecurity for all in the region.

SUMERNET is guided by SUMERNET Network Members (SNMs), who collectively deliberate on strategic issues that have implications for the whole network. The SNMs delegate their authority in taking strategic decisions to SUMERNET Steering Committee (SSC). The SUMERNET Secretariat (SS) hosted at the Asia Centre of Stockholm Environment Institute (SEI) provides the day-to-day management, coordination and technical support to the network under the direction of the SSC. The network currently consists of more than 390 members who are engaged with various activities under SUMERNET.
